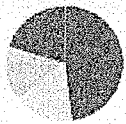

## THE SCHOOL AND THE COMMUNITY

Ross Beatty Jr./Sr. High School is a 7-12 building in a historic, rural setting that offers students a diverse learning experience. Spanning 138 square miles, Cassopolis Public Schools serves the educational needs of this area. The district enjoys a diversified economic base with a village population of about 1700 residents. Currently, the district consists of one high school, one elementary, and one alternative program. Ross Beatty Jr./Sr. High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling 410 students in grades 7-12.

## THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Ross Beatty Jr./Sr. High School students have the opportunity to take college credit courses, enroll in honor classes, and attend Van Buren Technology Center. Students are required to earn 28 credits to graduate. Students must fulfill the Michigan Merit Curriculum (MMC) requirements, meet the school requirements for basic coursework, and earn the total number of credits to receive a Ross Beatty Jr./Sr. High School Diploma.

### Senior Scholars:

Scholars will be determined by calculating their cumulative GPA, course selection, and SAT scores. The 10 students with the highest points will be honored at the graduation ceremony.

### Honor Points:

Honor points are awarded to certain academically challenging classes such as pre-calculus, College English (etc). A full credit must be earned in the class to receive an honor point. Honor points are reflected in course selection points when selecting Senior Scholars.
